In the approximate order of change:

- Yamaha case guards
- braided stainless brake and clutch lines
- frame brace
- Superbrace fork brace
- Works rear shocks and Works front internals w/ Gold Cartridge Emulators
- Flyscreen
- Stage 7 jet kit
- replacement of 2nd gear and dog shift cam and shift fork
- Ducati mirrors
- UFO Starfighter seat
- UFO exhaust system w/ carbon fiber silencers
- UFO VGAS intake system
- UFO shift light
- UFO turn signals
- UFO clear clutch cover
- new thermostat switch to enable fan at a lower temp
- external oil filter adapter kit
- relocated license plate w/ UFO LED taillight
- Odyssey battery
- UFO Quadzilla slip-ons for occasional swap w/cf silencers
- UFO 17" polished wheels
- 190/50ZR17 Avon Azaro rear tire and 120/70 ZR17 Bridgestone Battlax BT 016 front tire
- EBC rotors
- select polished aluminum parts.
